The Acorn Guild

Have you seen Hildy the Acorn Guild squirrel? You can join the Acorn Guild by making a \$100 donation, Money gained by the new

Acorn Guild will support and finance the Dr. Virginia M. Wagner Educational Award. This award is a Midwestern Region award and Midwestern Region is responsible for the funding. When you join the Acorn Guild you will receive a squirrel pin and the knowledge that you are assisting young women.

We've talked and talked for years about declining membership and what to do about it. We've also talked about how declining membership impacts the Virginia Wagner Award since this award is funded by MWR members. Fewer members equal less money for the award. Our solution to the funding question? **The Acorn Guild.** Think of us as squirrels gathering nuts for the winter. Nobody is coming to save us, so we are going to save ourselves.

The Acorn Guild resembles The Laurel Society, with a few exceptions. We're not asking you to donate a thousand dollars to become a member. Unless you want to donate a thousand, we'll take it! We won't have different levels of membership. Donate \$100 dollars and you are a member! Perks of membership include a delightful Acorn Guild sticker and a trinket of some kind – the first one will be a cute little squirrel pin. If you donate the next year, you'll get another doodad. The biggest perk though, is ensuring that the region has the ability to provide the Wagner Award.

This will be a three-year campaign with the goal of reaching at least \$100k. Proceeds will be deposited in a fund, separate from the region's investment portfolio funds. At the end of three years, an annual disbursement of half of earned interest will be withdrawn and used to help fund the Virginia Wagner Award, if needed. There will not be a withdraw if the return is negative or if we have sufficient cash on hand.

The Acorn Guild committee will be composed of a chairman, region governor, and region treasurer. The chairman will be appointed by the presiding governor and will provide fiduciary oversight for the three-year period. Funds cannot be withdrawn without the consent of the region board.
