Public Awareness:

Scholarships 2020/2021- It is time of year again to begin disseminating our scholarship information and applications. We now have enough judges for each scholarship.

- i. Soroptimist Prime: Applications due by November 15th.
- ii. Live Your Dream Award: Applications due by November 15th.
- iii. Virginia M. Wagner Award: Applications due by January 15th.

First Step- Due to need, a new First Step counselling office has opened up in Detroit.

Vista Maria- Is having another fundraiser to build a new facility in this area. Two grants we've previously been awarded have been given to them which paid for security in one of their buildings as well as staff program training.

Service:

Princess Scavenger Hunt 2020- The scavenger hunt fliers have been created, sponsors and prizes have been acquired, and maps, clues, and road signs are being created. There are presently 6 different small businesses participating as stops in the rally. 16 tickets have been sold thus far. We are proposing for the next rally to select superheroes as a theme so boys can also participate.

- Volunteers are needed to pass out/facilitate treats and activities at the various stops.
- ii. For volunteers that have signed up to pass out/ facilitate treats and activities at various stops, the location you are reporting to will be emailed to you prior to the event.
- iii. Nancy Nagle volunteered to pick up needed items from our storage unit.
- iv. Abby Premoe and Paetrah Collins will follow up with additional needs for the event.

Dream It Be It 2020- Dream It Be It participant numbers are down due to Covid, but they would still be very excited if we could do an event this year. Nancy Nagle tried her best to get an extension on the grant we

received for this event, but the grant money must be used by the end of this year. We are considering December 5th to have the 2020 Dream It Be It event so we do not lose the grant money.

Diversification of Fundraising and Beneficiaries- As our landscape of possible fundraising events change due to the pandemic, new ideas to raise funds amidst the limitations the pandemic poses are necessary. Additionally, in recognizing there are 17 different initiatives with categories ranging from Zero Hunger to Climate Action, consideration of partnerships with beneficiaries that fall under these categories could improve our initiative range as well as donor and new member exposure. The following are upcoming event ideas for consideration:

- i. Paetrah Collins has a friend who makes candles and has offered to split half of the sales proceeds of a custom candle with the club. It was proposed a custom water type scented candle be created for our club in which we would promote. Our half of the sales proceeds could be donated to a local water conservation or cleanup charity of some sort allowing us to begin contributing to SI's 6th sustainable initiative, Clean Water and Sanitation. Candles can be sold through our various online platforms or in person and can be delivered by us or picked up curbside by the buyer at a location permitting it.
- ii. The Virtual Run was profitable during its inauguration. There are still enough event magnets to consider conducting the event again this year during September or October before the weather gets too cold.
- iii. Ann Perano called Schwartz Nursery for pricing on wreathes and poinsettia plants for us to sell during Christmastime. They can be sold through our various online platforms or in person and can be delivered by us or picked up curbside by the buyer at a location permitting it. December 15th is the last day for order pickup. Lani will create the flier.
- iv. Hosting a "12 Days of Restaurants" event during Christmastime in which we partner with 12 different local restaurants who will create a special dish. On each night during the 12 days, one of the restaurants will offer their special dish for sale. The dish would be available by the restaurant indoors, for delivery, and/or for pickup to accommodate anyone who prefers to socially distance. The special dish will be promoted by us and a percentage of its sales would be donated to the club. v. BJ's Wholesale has reached out offering our club the opportunity to earn extra funds by providing us with a three-week period wherein we are given a form to use and share. Whenever someone uses our club's form to sign up for a new BJ's membership, or review an existing BJ's membership, our club will receive a portion of the membership sale.
